Then Jane had their fourth child and had to leave her part-time job. This made things tight but they managed. Then Jim was laid off indefinitely. After going through savings, selling the second car and disconnecting cable and internet, they were still not making it. They came to us discouraged and desperate. We served them joyfully and shared lots of additional resources and encouraged them to reach out to 211. They now had hope. There was a light at the end of the tunnel. Even when Jim found part-time work, things were still hard. They continue to come, always looking forward to sharing how things are going and prospects of new work. Simply a joy to work with. Even the kids look forward to our visits every 30 days. It is so wonderfully special to be a part of helping them get through hard times.
